

***** Signs of Speech & Language Disorder *****

Children: Signs of a Language Disorder

- Does not smile or interact with others (birth and older)
- Does not babble (4-7 months)
- Makes only a few sounds or gestures, like pointing (7-12 mons)
- Does not understand what others say (7 mon-2 yrs)
- Says only a few words (12-18 mons)
- Words are not easily understood (18 mons-2 yrs)
- Does not put words together to make sentences (1.5-3 yrs)
- Has trouble playing and talking with other children (2-3 yrs)
- Has trouble with early reading and writing skills (2.5-3 yrs)

Adults: Signs of Speech & Language Disorders

- Struggles to say sounds or words (stuttering)
- · Repetition of words or parts of words (stuttering)
- Speaks in short, fragmented phrases (expressive aphasia)
- Says words in the wrong order (expressive aphasia)
- Struggles with using words and understanding others (global aphasia)
- Difficulty imitating speech sounds (apraxia)
- Inconsistent errors (apraxia)
- Slow rate of speech (apraxia)
- Slurred speech (dysarthria)
- Slow or rapid rate of speech, often with a mumbling quality (dysarthria)
